Response/SERT Issues

- **Blue Sky:**

- We're in the process of refining our methods of information sharing (day to day operations):
 - Better situational awareness, better communication, in less time
 - Streamlining notifications to counties & agencies
 - Understanding “our” communication architecture – What’s out there in the counties? Who needs to know what?
 - EMnet / Voice Manager / NAWAS / email / phone / message forwarding
 - Weather notifications / alerts / critical information
 - Systems upgrades – more capability to tailor the systems
 - Incident Tracker

- **Grey Sky:**


- New Conference Call lines distributed

- Reduce the number of uninvited attendees
- Please keep number and pin “close hold”!

- Evacuation Strategy Conference Calls

- Goal – to reduce the number of daily state conf calls necessary for EM’s to attend
- No more separate evacuation conference calls
- Evacuation Strategy discussion will be added to the end of the scheduled County Conference Calls (11:15 & 17:15)
- Specific counties/agencies invited to remain on the County Call
- Agenda will follow the flow of Protective Action spreadsheet (Risk Co’s first, followed by Host Co’s, then Agencies) – Briefed by exception
- Kept as brief as possible

Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC)

- Requests for assistance
 - Do NOT reach out to impacted states
 - Contact DEM
- Should a local entity require assistance they MUST go through State EOC
- Law Enforcement Requests – ESF 16
- Fire and USAR Requests – ESF 4/9
- Other requests tasked depending on ESF
- Broadcast messages may be sent
- Cost Estimates



EMAC Deployment

- **Should plan to be self sufficient for three days unless otherwise told**
- **At least 14 days unless otherwise request by requesting State**
- **Daily situation reports need to be submitted**
- **Self deployments will not be supported**
- **FL EOC Activation**
- **Cost Estimates**
- **Copy of REQ A**

EMAC Reimbursement

- All responding are responsible for own expenses
 - No advance funds
- Reimbursement filed through Finance Section
 - Includes – original expense receipts (sign and dated), time sheets/payroll log signed in ink by supervisor, proof of payment, EMAC Reimbursement Form, Florida Travel Reimbursement Voucher (Statute 112.061)
- Reimbursement does not go to the team directly
 - May take several months to a year
- Cannot file for Reimbursement if Req-A was not properly executed

State Watch Office

- FDEM Response Bureau houses the State Watch Office, also referred to as the State Warning Point.
- The State Watch Office (SWO) is manned 24/7.
- Primary purpose is to record, analyze and share information with Federal, State and County partners for their appropriate response.
- The SWO is not a dispatch center but a clearinghouse of information to be shared with other government entities who can independently act within their own agency authority and protocols.

State Watch Office
INCIDENT REPORTING GUIDELINES
October 2011



Purpose

- To provide Florida's agencies and counties with guidelines for reportable incidents.
- The reported information is recorded and logged into the State Incident Tracker and shared with State Agencies in real time.
- The information sharing contributes to local, county, regional and State situational awareness and better coordination between state agencies for a response if needed.

Communications Checks

- Weekly communications checks are conducted by the SWO and Communications Unit to ensure usability and function.
- County participation in the weekly communications checks are required in order to meet this legal requirement as well as maintain emergency readiness at both a local and state level.

- Civil Disturbance
- Dam Failure
- Drinking Water Facility Reports
- DEM Internal Incidents
- Environmental Crimes (for DEP)

- Hazardous Materials:
 - Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Toxic Industrial Chemicals, or Unknown Hazard
- Kennedy Space Center
- Marine Incidents
- Migration
- Military Activity
- Nuclear Power Plants
- Petroleum Spills
- Population Protective Actions
- Public Health / Medical Issues
- Railroad Incidents
- Road Closures / Transportation Issues
- Search and Rescue
- Security Threats
- Utility Disruption or Emergency
- Vehicle Incidents
- Wastewater or Effluent Release
- Weather Advisories and Reports

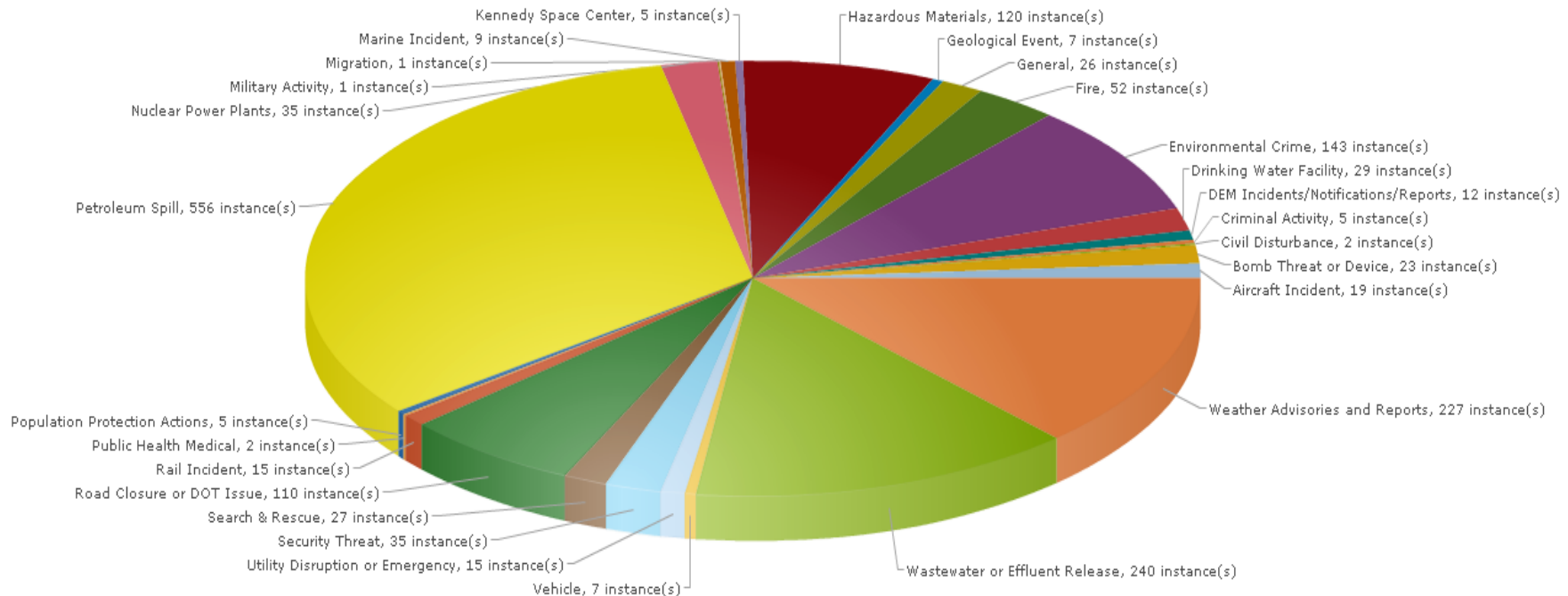
