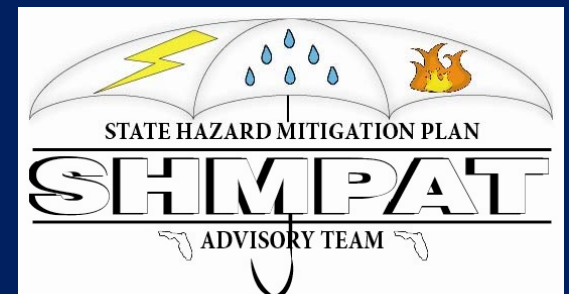

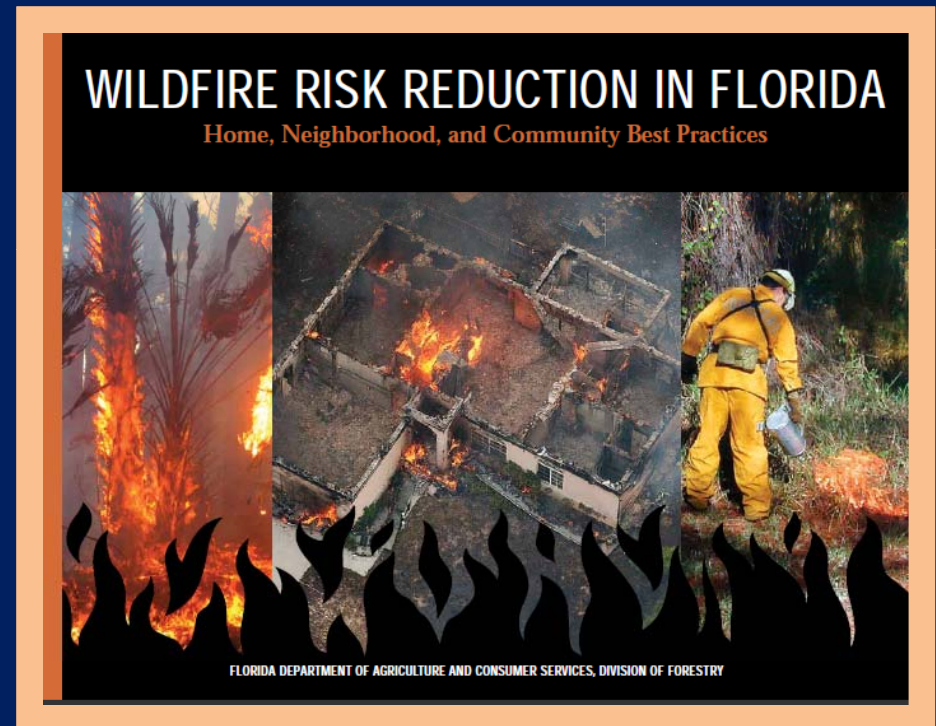
# FSU Partnership- Floodplain Plan Integration into LMS

- Counties that have volunteered for the pilot program should aware that interns will be contacting you soon to go over the next step.



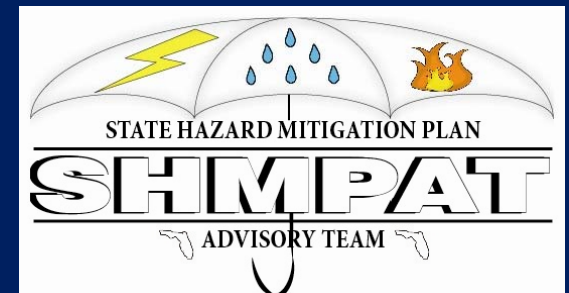

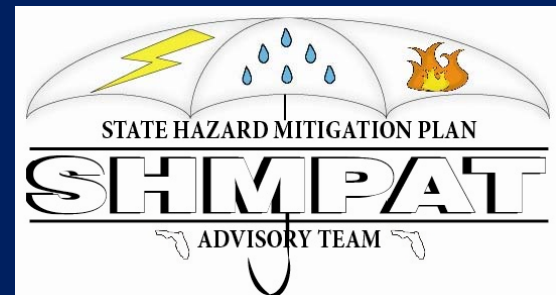

# Federal Non-Disaster Grant Programs

*Florida aggressively pursues these funds on behalf of communities where property owners are at risk.*



- Appropriated on an annual cycle
- Not disaster dependent

1. Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program (PDM)
2. Flood Mitigation Assistance Program (FMA)
3. Repetitive Flood Claims Program (RFC)
4. Severe Repetitive Loss Program (SRL)

# Flood Mitigation Assistance Program (FMA)

*The goal of FMA is to reduce or eliminate claims under the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP.)*

- Projects or Planning
- Structures must be NFIP insured to be eligible for funding.
- Cost Share:
  - Federal 75%
  - Non-federal 25%



***Since 2004, over \$19.8 million  
has been awarded under FMA with an additional  
\$14.1 million currently under FEMA review (as of 2/7/11).***

# Repetitive Flood Claims Program (RFC)

*The goal of RFC is to reduce repetitive flood damages in economically depressed areas and provide the greatest savings to the National Flood Insurance Fund (NFIF) in the shortest amount of time.*

- Nationally competitive
- 100% Federal share (no match)



***Florida has received almost \$12 million in RFC funding since its inception in 2006 with \$4.7 million currently under FEMA review (as of 2/7/11).***

# Severe Repetitive Loss Program (SRL)

*The goal of SRL is to reduce flood damage to severe repetitive loss properties, which will result in the greatest savings to the NFIF.*



- SRL is the only program under which “mitigation reconstruction” is an eligible project type.
- Cost Share (Section 7 SHMP):
  - Federal 90%
  - Non-federal 10%

***Florida has received almost \$10.5 million in federal SRL awards since the program began in 2008 with an additional \$2.8 million currently under FEMA review.***

*(as of 11/30/10)*

# Pre Disaster Mitigation Program (PDM)

*PDM provides funding to implement mitigation projects prior to a disaster event and for mitigation planning.*

- Annual Appropriation
  - 2011 – \$180 million
  - 2012 – \$200 million
  - 2013 – \$200 million
- \$575,000 minimum to each state annually
- Cost Share:
  - Federal 75%
  - Non-federal 25%



***Florida has received \$34.2 million in PDM funding since 2004 (as of 2/1/11)***

# *Florida's Own Mitigation Program*

## Residential Construction Mitigation Program (RCMP)

*Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program (Chapter 215.559, Florida Statutes)*

*– \$10 million appropriated annually from the Florida Hurricane  
Catastrophe Fund*

- \$7 million: RCMP
- \$3 million: Public Hurricane Shelter Retrofits
