DISTRICT 1

West Florida Regional Planning Council

Bay, Escambia, Holmes, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Walton and Washington Counties

LEPC Staffing

Staff attended the quarterly SERC/TTF/LEPC meeting in Tallahassee on October 4. Staff also held the Region 1 LEPC meeting in Crestview on October 15.

Earlier this year, members of the LEPC agreed to perform a more diligent review of the information available within the emergency plan. Four chapters would be emailed each quarter for review allowing for the entire document to be completed by June 2009. Staff recently received inputs on changes to the first four chapters of the plan. These next four chapters have been sent out to all committee members for review.

During the months of October and November, three courses in CAMEO/ALOHA for Hazmat Technicians, one in HSEEP and six Hazmat Awareness Level I courses were held throughout the district. Over 100 individuals receiving certificates for their participation.

In accordance with the biennial requirement, Region 1 will hold an exercise during this fiscal year. The exercise subcommittee will begin evaluating exercise options over the next three months.

Staff is actively participating in a statewide effort to prepare for Hazardous Materials Awareness Week (18 – 24 January 2009). This year the focus will be on mercury-containing devices found in many households, particularly within the compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs). Staff is working with local universities and colleges, county departments of health and Home Depot to hold televised panel discussions on the threats and proper disposal methods for mercury-containing devices.

The next District 1 LEPC meeting will be held on January 21, 2008.

DISTRICT 2

Apalachee Regional Planning Council

Calhoun, Franklin, Gadsden, Gulf, Jackson, Jefferson, Leon, Liberty and Wakulla Counties

The District 2 Local Emergency Planning Committee held its quarterly meeting on October 15th

at the Tallahassee Fire Department Training Division classroom. The following is a summary of recent LEPC staff activities over the last quarter:

Hazardous Materials Training

Although no training took place during this past quarter, staff coordinated with Tallahassee Memorial Healthcare (TMH) to begin development of a hazardous materials training program for staff for spring. In addition, staff had preliminary discussions with TMH to schedule a Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) course in late January/early February.

All training courses are posted on the Apalachee Regional Planning Council's website: www.theapc.com.

Fixed Facility Hazards Analysis

Staff received approval from FDEM on submitted revisions for the 2007-08 hazards analyses for Calhoun, Franklin, Gadsden, Gulf, Jefferson, Liberty, Leon and Wakulla Counties. Staff distributed the completed Hazards Analyses to county first responders and assisted Leon County Emergency Management with installation of the new version of CAMEO. In addition, staff completed and submitted the first 50% deliverable to FDEM.

LEPC Plan Update

Staff received approval by FDEM on the updated District II LEPC Hazardous Materials Plan. The Plan was made available to LEPC members at the October 15, 2008 quarterly meeting.

Hazardous Materials Awareness Week

Staff coordinated with FDEM and the other Florida LEPC staff to plan events and activities for the January 2009 Hazardous Materials Awareness Week. The District 2 LEPC will hold a media event at a local Home Depot to emphasize proper disposal and clean-up of compact fluorescent light (CFL) bulbs. In addition, a Shelter-In-Place simulation will take place on site.

Next LEPC meeting

The next meeting of the District 2 LEPC will be held on January 14, 2009 at 10:00 am EDT at the Tallahassee Fire Department Training Division classroom. As always, anyone interested in attending the LEPC meeting is welcome.

DISTRICT 3

North Central Florida Regional Planning Council

Alachua, Bradford, Columbia, Dixie, Gilchrist, Hamilton, Lafayette, Madison, Suwannee, Taylor and Union Counties

The North Central Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee (Florida District 3) last met at

the new Gilchrist County Emergency Operations Center on November 14, 2008. Items discussed included whether there is a need for additional LEPC membership categories, activities for Hazardous Materials Awareness Week, hazmat training results and Tier Two data distribution using E-Plan. The North Central Florida Regional Hazmat Team Policy Board met following the LEPC meeting.

The LEPC discussed whether there is a need for creating new LEPC membership occupational categories. It was concluded that our priority should continue to work to fill all existing mandated categories. The LEPC voted to oppose the addition of any additional categories by the State Emergency Response Commission because SERC Guidelines as well as EPCRA already allow a member from non-required category to be placed in the Interested Citizens category. The LEPC also supports allowing one LEPC member to represent two occupational categories, as authorized by the U.S. EPA. The LEPC voted to forward proposed, revised membership procedures to resolve these two issues.

Public outreach activities for 2009 Hazardous Materials Awareness Week were discussed. Local television, radio and print media will be invited to all activities. The LEPC will kick off its public education campaign to educate homeowners on how they can safely clean-up a broken compact fluorescent light (CFL). A key issue is that a hazardous materials response team is not needed if an energy efficient CFL is broken in a home. The LEPC will also promote the awareness of existing recycling options for CFLs.

For Hazardous Materials Awareness Week, the District 3 LEPC is partnering with the North Central Florida Regional Hazardous Materials Response Team to hold a Hazmat Boot Camp in Gainesville on January 21, 2009. Lake City (Columbia County) water and wastewater plant operators will be presented with State Emergency Response Commission Certificates of Appreciation in recognition of increasing community safety by replacing ton containers of toxic chlorine in populated areas with a safer alternative.

During the recently completed 2007-2008 fiscal year, the LEPC conducted 19 hazmat classes with a total of 236 students completing 1,457 hours. Training was offered at the Awareness, Operations and Technician levels. Eighteen people completed Awareness Level Train-the-Trainer classes allowing the LEPC to focus on more advanced training needs. The goal for this year is to begin teaching the IAFF 160 hour technician classes utilizing the Hazmat Boot Camp and the Regional Team's training trailer.

Staff activities include providing administrative support to the LEPC, scheduling and teaching hazmat classes, and using CAMEO_{fm} to update hazards analyses for seven counties. Staff continues to provide administrative support for the North Central Florida Regional Hazardous Materials Response Team. Staff is working with one community to maximize chemical safety preparedness during the expansion of a local high-tech chemical processing facility.

Staff helped teach a Homeland Security Exercise Evaluation Program (HSEEP) class in Niceville for the District I LEPC. The LEPC displayed its Shelter In-Place demonstration house at the

annual Columbia County Safety Expo. Staff attended Current Issues in Emergency Management, DEM Area 3 meeting and HAZUS Workshop. Staff has participated in LEPC conference calls on Hazardous Materials Awareness Week and membership categories.

The LEPC decided to move its quarterly meetings from Fridays to Thursdays to accommodate local governments shifting to four-day work weeks. The next LEPC meeting is tentatively scheduled for February 19, 2009, at White Springs (Hamilton County).

DISTRICT 4

Northeast Florida Regional Council

Baker, Clay, Duval, Flagler, Nassau, Putnam and St. Johns Counties

November 2008

The previous District IV Local Emergency Planning Committee meeting was held on November 12, 2008 at the Northeast Florida Regional Council Office at 6850 Belfort Oaks Place Jacksonville, FL 32216

2008/2009 Hazards Analysis (HA) Staff has begun work on the 2008/2009 Hazardous Analysis information to be provided to the Division of Emergency Management for five counties that include Baker, Clay, Nassau, Putnam, and St. Johns counties. Staff will be coordinating with representatives of the Section 302 facilities to schedule site visits inspection.

HMEP

Training

A meeting of the District Training Committee took place on December 5, 2008 at the Clay County Fire Rescue Station on Fleming Island. The District discussed its training goals for the upcoming year and how best to utilize the resources provided through this grant funding, as well as training needs and a regional direction. Staff also contacted several County and Municipal level HazMat response organizations to help identify what issues or concerns could the LEPC help address in the Region during this planning meeting. Our training for this previous quarter consisted of:

Incident Command Systems - November 3 – 7, 2008 in Orange Park, FL:

Several courses were taught to first responders under the framework of the nationally standardized Incident Command structure and the process associated with Disaster Management, with an emphasis on the Planning and Logistics Section Chiefs, Receiving and Distribution Manager, Status Check-In Recorder, and Supply and Resource Unit Leaders. Registration included thirty responders or firefighters from across various departments from around the District who received this training for incident management. The courses were housed at the Town of Orange Park Fire Station.

2008 Fire Department Safety Officers Association Annual Safety Forum - October 27 – 31, 2008 in Orlando, FL: Four participants from the Region will attend the Safety Forums and the Incident Safety Officer (ISO) Academy. This is a 16-hour certification course designed to improve firefighters' effectiveness as the Incident Safety Officer on scene, through in-depth knowledge and training, as well as situational exercises and scenario practice.

Infrared Spectroscopy - October 14 – 16, 2008 Fleming Island, FL: Response Technologies of Sarasota, FL provided an 8-hour, in-service course over three days to provide hazardous technicians with the experience to classify and/or identify unknown chemical compounds or mixtures using an infrared spectroscopy technique. This method of analysis uses an electromagnetic spectrum to help identify the frequencies at which the molecules of an unknown chemical are vibrating. This process is very useful when HazMat teams responding to an incident do not know which substance it is and must plan their safety tactics around that knowledge. In addition, the course addresses both automated and manual interpretation methods of analysis.

Planning

Quality Control of Submitted Tier II Information- On behalf of the LEPC, Staff performed a quality control of the Tier IIs that were submitted by the Section 302 and 311/312 facilities within the district. Staff will be contacting all of the facilities, especially those that submitted Tier IIs that contained four (4) or more errors to educate the facility representative on the proper completion of Tier II forms and use of the State Emergency Response Commission How-to-Comply Handbook. Staff has prepared and submitted to the Division a report of the Tier IIs reviewed and has recommended form corrections to the facilities. The results of this planning project will be incorporated into the 2009 annual update of the LEPC's hazardous materials emergency response plan.

In addition, Staff has been preparing a series of How-to-Comply Workshops catered to facility representatives to educate them on the proper method of filing their Tier II report.

District 5

Withlacoochee Regional Planning Council

Citrus, Hernando, Levy, Marion and Sumter Counties

During the quarter, staff from the Withlacoochee Regional Planning Council (WRPC) attended meetings in Tallahassee on October 2nd and 3rd, 2008. The regular quarterly LEPC Training Committee meeting was held prior to the LEPC meeting on October 15. The training committee opened the floor for training needs and requests for this upcoming funding cycle.

The LEPC co-hosted a three day, twenty four hour CAMEO course attended primarily by members of Marion County Fire Rescue and Ocala Fire Rescue. Withlacoochee Regional

Planning Council has conducted Hazard Analysis for 16 locations in Levy and Sumter Counties. Staff has also selected and begun work on Option 7: Shelter-In-Place Education Enhancement for this year's HMEP planning project.

District 5 is considering holding the following courses during this funding cycle. The courses up for consideration are Incident Command for HazMat in 24 or 40 hour course length, HazMedic course 8 hour or 24 hour course length and HazMat IQ. These courses are being considered based upon demand and scheduling availability.

DISTRICT 6

East Central Florida Regional Planning Council

Brevard, Lake Orange, Osceola, Seminole and Volusia Counties

The District VI Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) meeting was held October 17, 2008 at the Regional Planning Council office in Maitland.

The Training sub-committee met before the LEPC meeting in October. The LEPC co-sponsored an Advanced Radiological Monitoring Course with the Central Florida Fire Academy in mid-October. The LEPC is sponsoring three 16-hour Tank Truck Emergency Courses on a shift friendly schedule from January 26-31, 2009. Additional courses being organized in the future for the district include Foam/Ethanol training, HazMat Operations Refresher courses, and a Propane Gas Class. There are also three 'How to Comply' Workshops scheduled for January 2009 in locations around the district.

Staff attended the Region 5 Division of Emergency Management meeting on November 5th at the Orlando Emergency Operations Center. Staff also attended a Risk Management Program (RMP) audit with staff members from DEM on Friday, October 10th in New Smyrna Beach at the Water Treatment Plant. Finally, staff participated in Teach-In day on November 19th, 2008 in Orlando, Florida at Rock Lake Elementary School. Staff demonstrated how to properly Shelter-In-Place using model houses for the 3rd grade students, their teachers, and parents.

The 2008-2009 LEPC Biennial Exercise was held on December 9th, 2008. The exercise was a Table-top in Osceola County. Members of the Osceola County Office of Emergency Management as well as members of the District VI LEPC assisted with the planning and evaluation of this exercise.

The LEPC is also preparing for Hazardous Materials Awareness Week that will take place January 18th-24th, 2009. Contact has been made with the County Household Hazardous Waste Collection centers and the local Home Depots. The LEPC is working on the best way to promote the proper handling and recycling of compact fluorescent bulbs that contain small amounts of mercury.

The next District VI LEPC meeting will be held January 23, 2009 at the East Central Florida Regional Planning Council Office in Maitland.

DISTRICT 7

Central Florida Regional Planning Council

DeSoto, Hardee, Highlands, Okeechobee and Polk Counties

SEPTEMBER

On September 16th & 17th LEPC District 7 sponsored the HAZMAT IQ course that was presented in Okeechobee. This class was presented over two days to allow maximum participation by the shift workers from the fire departments. Okeechobee County Fire Chief Nick Hopkins stated that this was the best class he has ever attended in his 30+ years in the fire service. While somewhat expensive, the HAZMAT IQ class continues to be the most requested instruction in our district. This is especially true among our small, rural counties who do not have the funds to train and maintain a HAZMAT team.

The Hazards Analysis inspections were coordinated and completed for Okeechobee County and submitted for review to the State. These inspections were conducted September 15th & 16th.

We held our LEPC meeting on September 17th in Okeechobee. The focus of this meeting was to take a look at training needs for the rest of the year and to determine how best to meet those needs. Additional discussions were also held in relation to the Statewide Evacuation Study, particularly relating to the verification of shelter and critical facilities inventory data.

The final draft of the After Action Report concerning the Multi-Vehicle Accident on I-4 was presented to Polk County Emergency Management and the improvement plan was developed in concept. This documentation of a real world event was substituted for our biennial exercise. The final approval meetings with the various agencies involved in the response to this accident were scheduled for late September and early October to have each agency approve their own requirements in the Improvement Plan.

The SQG inspections were completed for and submitted to DeSoto and Okeechobee Counties.

OCTOBER

On October 2nd Mr. Carter and our LEPC Chairman, Mr. Gary Weiss, attended the SERC Subcommittee for Training meeting and the LEPC Chairmen and Staff meeting in Tallahassee.

The After Action Report on the I-4 Multi-Vehicle Accident improvement plans were completed and approved by the various agencies of Polk County and the document was accepted by the

Emergency Management Director for implementation. This After Action Report evaluated a total of ten separate capabilities contained four pages of lessons learned from this major event.

On October 17th there was a major sulfur dioxide leak at the Mosaic plant in Bartow. As a result of this leak there were several people evacuated for treatment at local medical facilities and one man held overnight for observation. The response by City of Bartow and Polk County Fire, EMS and Hazmat teams was exceptional.

The SQG inspections were completed for and submitted to Hardee County.

NOVEMBER

With the observation of Veterans Day and the celebration of Thanksgiving this was a fairly quiet month.

Mr. Carter and our LEPC Chairman participated in a tele-conference meeting to discuss the possibility of recommending changes to the membership categories of the LEPC. This action was a result of discussions held at the October SERC meeting.

The information relating to the membership categories for the LEPC was passed on at our LEPC meeting on November 19th and the committee made several recommendations that will be passed along at the next subcommittee meeting.

Also, at the meeting LEPC District 7 voted to change to a four meeting per year structure instead of the previous six meeting per year format that we have used for many years.

The SQG inspections were completed for and submitted to Okeechobee County.

HAZMAT IQ continues to be the most requested instruction throughout our region. The City of Lakeland presented this class for four consecutive days to their fire service and had standing room only for most of the classes. LEPC District 7 sponsored one day of the training.

It continues to be a pleasure to work with all of the members of the various agencies in our region and the state. The Staff and Members of LEPC District 7 want to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy and prosperous New Year.

DISTRICT 8

Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council

Hillsborough, Manatee, Pasco and Pinellas Counties

District 8 was involved in a number of HMEP and LEPC co-sponsored activities this quarter. Staff attended the Quarterly SERC meetings in Tallahassee October 9-10, 2008. Staff conducted one LEPC Meeting on November 19, 2008. In 2009 the Tampa Bay LEPC will begin meeting

on a quarterly schedule versus a bimonthly schedule.

The Tampa Bay LEPC is continuing with the HMEP Planning Project A-2 Section 302 Facility Outreach with Facility Disaster Planning Workshops as a follow-on to the planning workshops held previously. Betti Johnson of the TBRPC briefed the latest version of the Florida Disaster Survival Kit which is now interactive and online at and will guide businesses through the process of writing an all-hazards plan. The Subcommittee will focus on providing significant data to serve as an annex to the *Florida Business Disaster Survival Kit*, accessible through the internet at www.fldisasterkit.com. As a follow-up and refinement of duties, subcommittee meetings and/or teleconferences are tentatively planned for December 2nd and December 17th with a gathering of the entire subcommittee on January 6, 2009. The subcommittee is currently caucusing to determine what directions will be taken for 2009 since this will still be an important part of our overall HMEP Planning Project on Section 302 Outreach.

There were a couple of HMEP training classes conducted this quarter: Rail Safety for Public Responder, was held November 11-13, 2008 in Manatee County. The Tampa Bay LEPC hosted the CSX Transportation Functional Exercise conducted at the St. Petersburg College Allstate Center on November 13, 2008. The exercise was a great success and was similar to the one conducted in Hialeah in South Florida and the one planned for Orlando. We will be sponsoring an Air Monitoring Course conducted in Pasco County by Doug Wolfe on December 4, 2008 and will likely offer additional courses in 2009.

Staff represented the Tampa Bay LEPC at the Tampa Bay Spill Committee on August 14, 2008 as well as the US Coast Guard Area Committee on the same dates following the Spill Control meeting.

The Pinellas Police Standards Council continues to meet at the TBRPC under LEPC sponsorship. Staff assisted with the October 8 and the November 12 meetings and intends on assisting for the December 10, 2008 event.

The next LEPC meeting will be February 25, 2009.

DISTRICT 9

Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council

Charlotte, Collier, Glades, Hendry, Lee and Sarasota Counties



The Southwest Florida (District IX) Local Emergency Planning Committee met December 5, 2008, at the offices of the Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council. Special guest during the proceedings was Chairman George Danz of the LEPC Chair of Chairs Group. Chairman Danz expressed his appreciation to the Southwest Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee for the good work that is being accomplished. He further commented that without individual participation from members; Florida's LEPCs could not exist. Four former LEPC members were recognized with plaques for their outstanding service to the Southwest Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee and the community.

In another matter, the Committee decided to table its decision regarding invocations during future meetings. The Committee directed LEPC staff to provide additional information concerning current state policies or current state practices.

Under the Committee's "Hazardous Materials Awareness Week" initiatives, LEPC staff noted that the Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council approved a proclamation which would be distributed to political subdivisions of the region. Also, a representative of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection indicated that the department would support the LEPC during Hazardous "Materials Awareness Week" by providing posters and brochures as handouts at the Home Depot operations and other collection centers of the region. Another suggestion was that the LEPC provide permanent displays containing LEPC

posters and pamphlets at recycling locations. Other activities will include:

- An Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act “How to Comply” workshop, January 20, 2009.
- A Public Availability Notice will be included in a local newspaper of the region during Hazardous Materials Awareness Week.
- Hazardous Materials Awareness information will be posted on the LEPC’s website during the week of January 18-24, 2009.

The following dates were selected by the Southwest Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee and Southwest Florida Hazmat Team Leaders as their official quarterly meetings during 2009:

- February 26, 2009
- May 28, 2009
- August 27, 2009
- December 4, 2009

The HMEP Training and Planning Grants were approved by the Southwest Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee and the LEPC proposed model city demonstration project initiative was discussed. The body will be looking at existing models of the region as well as researching potential vendors.

A revised informational membership package was provided to LEPC members for review and use. The following LEPC Occupational Categories were recommended by the Southwest Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee:

- Safety & Risk Management
- Education Facilities
- Training

Additionally, the body suggested an update of terminology for some categories, especially for Civil Defense which should be Emergency Management.

The next quarterly meeting of the Southwest Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee is scheduled February 26, 2009. Additional information regarding the programs and activities of the Committee can be obtained by viewing www.swfrpc.org.

DISTRICT 10

Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council

Indian River, Martin, Palm Beach and St. Lucie Counties

The last District 10 Local Emergency Planning Committee meeting was held November 6, 2008 at the Indian River State College Chastain Campus, Stuart, Florida. The next meeting is February 5, 2009 at the Indian River State College Chastain Campus, Stuart, Florida.

LEPC Activities

The Planning Sub-committee is reviewing the District 10 Regional Hazardous Materials Response Plan for the 2008/2009 update. The 2007/2008 plan was submitted and approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management at the October SERC meeting. The Planning Sub-committee met on November 6, 2008 to define concepts and develop preliminary objectives for the 2009 biennial exercise. Discussion focused on stakeholders, discussion and operations based exercise options and areas for improvement or training. The exercise date will be decided by the sub-committee at the Initial Planning Conference.

Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP)

Training

District 10 sponsored the following Hazardous Materials Awareness classes in the fourth quarter of the HMEP contract year:

- Awareness/Operations Clandestine (Methlab) September 23-24, 2008, Stuart, FL – 27 attendees
- Hazardous Materials Medical Technician September 25-27, 2008 Boca Raton, FL - 24 attendees
- HazMat IQ Smart Charts October 6, 2008, West Palm Beach, FL – 37 attendees

Planning

The District 10 LEPC has selected Planning Project Option 3, Local Emergency Planning Committee Plan Exercise, from the list of approved activities to be carried out under the planning grant for the 2008/2009 cycle. Tasks include a full-scale exercise testing three functional areas, scenario development, regional coordination and an after-action report. The sub-committee is currently developing a list of stakeholders, defining goals and objectives and discussing locations and resources.

Hazards Analysis

The Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council utilizing District 10 LEPC staff is in the process

of conducting the 2008 Hazards Analysis for St. Lucie and Martin Counties. Staff distributed completed analyses of updated Section 302 facility information to the respective county emergency management offices and hazardous materials teams. Hazards Analyses are conducted annually for those facilities reporting annually to the Florida State Division of Emergency Management under the Emergency Community Right-To-Know Act (EPCRA).

DISTRICT 11

South Florida Regional Planning Council
Miami-Dade, Broward and Monroe Counties

The South Florida LEPC (SoFlaLEPC) met on December 3, 2008 at the South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) offices in Hollywood, Florida. The Committee accepted a list of recommended courses from the Training Subcommittee to be offered this fiscal year. In addition, **Quality Control of Submitted Tier II Information** was chosen for the annual HMEP Planning Grant Option.

The SoFlaLEPC Training Subcommittee met on September 24, 2008 at the SFRPC offices in Hollywood. Subcommittee members reviewed a list of the training courses offered over the last five years and voted to submit to the LEPC a list of six classes for the coming year. These were **HAZWOPER, CAMEO, HazMat Awareness, WMD-HazMat Awareness, HazMatIQ and Chemical Compatibility and Storage.**

The SoFlaLEPC hosted a **CSX Railroad Functional Exercise** on September 3, 2008 in the City of Hialeah. Nearly 70 participants took part in the event which was held at the Henry Milander Auditorium. The exercise featured sophisticated audiovisual elements used to enhance the simulation of a train derailment and subsequent hazardous chemical release.

Several training courses were presented during this reporting period. A **HazMat Awareness Class** was held on September 29, 2008 in Hollywood. Two **Proper Use of Emergency Response Guidebook and CHEMTREC Classes** were offered on October 15 and 16, 2008 in Miami. These classes were scheduled earlier in the year but postponed due to T.S. Fay. A session of the very popular **Chemical Compatibility and Storage Class** was also presented in Key West on October 30, 2008.

SoFlaLEPC staff participated in two Risk Management Program audits conducted by FDEM at the Florida Keys Aqueduct Authority (FKAA) Water Treatment Plant in Florida City and the City of Homestead's Harris Field Water Treatment Plant. In addition, the first deliverable of Hazards Analyses for Monroe County was completed during this reporting period.
