Section 252.9335 modifies Florida’s legislative enactment of the Emergency Management Assistance Compact (“EMAC”) in order to clarify that the Florida Division of Emergency Management (“Division”) can reimburse employees at the travel expense reimbursement rates of an EMAC requesting state. Prior to this statutory change, the Department of Financial Services (“DFS”) interpreted section 112.061, Florida Statutes, as well as its own rules, as limiting reimbursement to the travel expense reimbursement rates of Florida as the EMAC the sending state.
