**Meteorology (Weather Update)**

A cold front will move across the Mississippi River Valley today and into the Southeastern States by this evening, bringing widespread showers and thunderstorms along and ahead of the front as it moves east. The main threat with strong storms will be damaging winds, but isolated tornadoes will also be possible. Today and tomorrow's temperatures will be above normal and humid, but will be improved heading into Friday and the weekend with drier air and partly cloudy skies. This cold front will be less severe than previous fronts this season, bringing lows in the upper 40s to the Northeast and Central areas and low 60s across the South. There is an elevated risk for rip currents with the cold front, but should decrease by the weekend.
