RE: FEMA 1785-DR-FL 6 MONTH LOCK-IN - COUNTY ALLOCATIONS

In accordance with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) Administrative Plan for Tropical Storm Fay (FEMA 1785-DR-FL), the following information is being disseminated to Local Mitigation Strategy (LMS) chairs and State Area Regional Coordinators. Please share this message with your local officials.

As of February 26, 2009, FEMA has made available the 6-month lock-in totals for Tropical Storm Fay. The available funding for HMGP Regular projects has been set at \$13,341,352.

While this is a significant decrease in FEMA's previously estimated figure, which was based upon preliminary damage estimates forwarded by impacted communities, funding is a percentage of the aggregate amount of Tropical Storm Fay Assistance given under the Stafford Act to include Public Assistance, Individual Assistance and Small Business Administration loans.

Your county's adjusted allocation (attached) is calculated based on proportional shares of the total federal share assistance to the State. The State will review and recommend local projects according to the Local Mitigation Strategy prioritization letters.
