To Whom It May Concern,

Pursuant to section 252.351(3), Florida Statutes (F.S.), political subdivisions shall provide prompt notification to the State Watch Office (SWO) at the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) when an incident on the list of reportable incidents has occurred within its geographical boundaries, following the initial response to the incident.

FDEM hereby gives notice that, effective December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, and pursuant to section 252.351, F.S., the criteria for reporting existing incident types shall be amended to include incidents related to:

- Civil Disturbance
- Critical Infrastructure

A brief overview of the changes to the criteria for the above-mentioned incident types is provided below to assist political subdivisions in determining if an incident meets the new reportable criteria:

**Civil Disturbance**: Any protests or assemblies planned or unplanned, for which there are identified potential threats to public safety or disruption of public infrastructure to include State or Federal roadways, critical infrastructure sites, and government buildings.

**Critical Infrastructure**: Any incidents impacting the operational functionality or security of a critical infrastructure facility as defined by section 330.41(2b), F.S.
