Section 252.3568, Florida Statutes, requires the Florida Division of Emergency Management (“Division”) to address strategies for the evacuation of persons with pets in the shelter component of the State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan (“CEMP”). It requires the Department of Agriculture and Department of Education to assist the Division in determining strategies regarding sheltering persons with pets. The CEMP is updated every two year and the 2020 CEMP is currently incorporated by reference in Rule 27P-2.002, Florida Administrative Code. The amendment of section 252.3568, Florida Statutes, does not currently require any rulemaking.

Section 252.351, Florida Statutes, requires political subdivisions to report certain incidents to the State Watch Office (“SWO”) established per section 14.2016, Florida Statutes. It directs the Division to create and maintain a list of reportable incidents and specifics that certain incidents shall be on the list. It authorizes the Division to add additional incidents to the list. It authorizes the Division to establish guidelines specifying the method and format a political subdivision uses when reporting an incident. It requires the Division to provide the list of reportable incidents to each political subdivision by December 1 and each year thereafter. At this time, the Division will not add to the list of mandatory reportable incidents nor prescribe the method and format for reporting an incident.

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Section 120.75(1)(b), Florida Statutes – List of laws for which agency expects to implement rulemaking by July 1. For each law, the plan must state whether the rulemaking is intended to simplify, clarify, increase efficiency, improve coordination with other agencies, reduce regulatory costs, or delete obsolete, unnecessary, or redundant rules.


