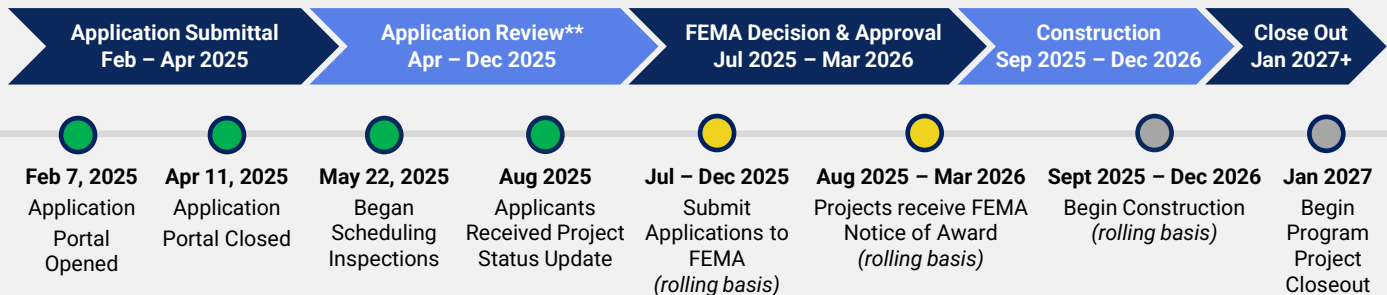
Elevate Florida is an innovative statewide initiative aimed at improving the resilience of **around 2,000*** homes by using more than **\$400 million** in federal funding.

Program Update

In August, over 10,200 Elevate Florida property owners were notified of their status which included moving forward in the program, being waitlisted/on-hold, or being deferred to other funding sources. 305 Property Owners had their applications sent to FEMA for funding determination.

Elevate Florida began sending Pre-Mitigation Agreements (PMA) to applicants moving forward in the program. Once their PMA and cost-share requirements are met, the program will schedule pre-construction inspections. As inspections are completed throughout September and the following months, Elevate Florida will continue finalizing application packages and will submit them on a rolling basis to FEMA for funding determination.

Hot Topic: Temporary Relocation

Property owners and/or tenants cannot reside on the property during construction, except for certain Wind Mitigation projects. Temporary relocation is an eligible project cost that is subject to the 25% cost-share. Property Owners will pay their portion of the cost-share up front before construction can begin. Property Owners are also responsible for a 25% cost-share for eligible tenants.

In addition to temporary housing assistance, Mitigation Reconstruction projects are eligible for storage assistance during the construction period. For Acquisition-Demolition projects, Property Owners will be responsible for making their own relocation arrangements, but Acquisition-Demolition tenants may be eligible for temporary relocation assistance.

Before Elevate Florida sends an application to FEMA for final funding determination, Case Managers will contact Property Owners to share information about temporary relocation services and provide a Temporary Relocation Form (TRF). This form helps the Elevate Florida program understand the household's current circumstances, needs, and preferences as they relate to temporary relocation during construction.

After FEMA approval but before initiating construction, Property Owners that indicated interest in temporary relocation on the TRF will have the opportunity to opt in or out of participation in Elevate Florida's temporary relocation services. If the Property Owner opts into the services, their Case Manager will support arrangements for residents during the construction period. The cost of temporary relocation will be included in the total project cost outlined in the Homeowner Grant Agreement but is subject to change based on the actual duration of stay.
