SUBJECT: **2020 Annual Registration Filing Deadline**

Your company is currently registered with the SERC under the obligations of the [Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act \(EPCRA\)](#). In accordance with the Florida Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act ([Chapter 252, Part II](#), Florida Statutes) and implementing rules ([Rule Chapter 27P-14](#), F.A.C.), the SERC is providing you with the following information to assist in complying with Florida's annual reporting requirements. Owners or operators of facilities subject to Sections 302 and/or 312 reporting requirements of the Act must file with the Commission no later than **March 1, 2021**.

Please be advised that the State of Florida no longer accepts paper Tier II reports or paper checks. All filings and payments must be submitted via E-Plan, which can be accessed at: www.erplan.net. The accepted forms of payment are **credit card** and **electronic funds transfer (ACH)**. E-Plan filing instructions are available at:

Owners or operators that have previously filed with the State of Florida should use their existing Access IDs and passwords to file online. Please contact FDEM staff if you have forgotten your Access ID or password. **Please do not create a new account.** The previous year's data may be copied to the current filing year (January 2020 – December 2020) and updated as needed. Currently, the Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPCs) accept online Tier 2 filing in lieu of paper forms.
